	Noah Minor attended the Lake Stewards of Maine session, and they explained while we can't alter the lake's geology or history, we can control our actions in how we treat the lake. For example, what is developed on the lake, run off areas, limiting the use of fertilizers and pesticides. All these items can affect the quality of the water.		
	Noah Minor also provided some insight on the spread of milfoil. One of the bigger concerns is other bodies of waters with milfoil nearby. With people bringing boats, jet skis, fishing tackle, etc. if not properly cleaned could introduce milfoil into our lake. With no public launch, which is great for the lake, it's everyone's responsibility to ensure if you allow someone to launch a watercraft, they are clean.		
WATER QUALITY	Kathy Georgens and Noah Minor spoke about possibly purchasing a dissolved		
TESTING	oxygen meter. Noah Minor explained that you basically take every 5 feet readings on the dissolved oxygen. This would help provide data on the levels		
	of oxygen in various parts of the lake. Essentially this provides the next level		
	from performing the Secchi readings we currently do. The meter has other probes that can be purchased to provide things like PH, etc. The Lake		
	Stewards of Maine also recommends doing a Phosphorous test once a year.		
	This requires a sampling of water and sent out for analysis. The meter cost ~ 2-5 thousand dollars. Training can be provided by the Lake Stewards of		
	Maine.
